**Fee Waiver at the Victorian Civil and Administrative Tribunal**

VCAT is able to waive any application fee, hearing fee or administrative fee payable to it if payment of the fee would cause the individual responsible for its payment financial hardship<sup>1</sup>. This information is about applications to all lists at VCAT except the Guardianship List. **Please note that businesses and associations are not eligible for fee waiver.**

As a general guide<sup>2</sup> fees may be waived due to financial hardship if the applicant:

1. is a person who has no partner or children, is not in the workforce, his or her after tax income is below \$415 per week and he or she does not have cash assets of \$3,000 or more; or
2. is a person who has a partner, neither are in the workforce, has two children, his or her after tax income is \$701 per week, and he or she does not have cash assets of \$5,000 or more.

If the person's income is above these levels, the fee will be payable unless there are exceptional circumstances.

A person who wishes to have a fee waived will assist VCAT to make its decision if he or she uses the VCAT fee waiver form to provide:

- a statutory declaration stating:
  - his or her current income (after tax) and expenses per week; and
  - bank balance; and
  - whether the person has a partner and/or dependants (not including a partner) and whether the person or partner is in the workforce; and
  - what effect the payment of the fee will have on the person's financial situation (i.e. will the payment result in the applicant suffering financial hardship); and
- provides a copy of any current Commonwealth Government Benefit Card he or she may hold.

If there is more than one applicant, each applicant should provide an Application for Fee Waiver form.

Once the above information is provided, the Principal Registrar of VCAT will decide whether to waive the fee and advise the applicant of the decision.
